On November 8, 2022, California State Assemblyman Josh Hoover was elected to represent the 7th Assembly District in Sacramento County. 
Dawn and her husband Marcus have raised two children on the Central Coast and they have one rescue cat named Oppenheimer.










## MARIE ALVARADO-GIL
